Accreditation Report Executive Summary

▪ **General information on the education Program**

The European Studies Doctoral Program aims to implement theoretical and practical research using the EU-related interdisciplinary approach, which enables the future doctors to carry out profound and comprehensive research and analytical activities from the EU legal, economic, social-political and historical perspective,

▪ **Brief overview of the accreditation site-visit**

The accreditation site-visit to the Tbilisi State University took place on 29 July 2019. The Expert Panel held meetings and interviews with the University administration, with faculty full time and invited members and PhD supervisors, Program students, representatives of employers, University and faculty quality assurance unit heads. At the end of working day the Expert Panel made preliminary presentation of the main findings.

▪ **Summary of education Program's compliance with the standards**

The Expert Panel on the basis information collected through Program Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and the Site Visit discovered that in general the Program meets all accreditation standards. More specifically the Program substantially complies with requirements related with educational Program objectives, learning outcomes and teaching methodology and organization. Full compliance with requirements can be seen against standards related with student achievements and individual work with them, teaching resources and teaching quality enhancement.

▪ **Summary of Recommendations**

- to strengthen the Program learning outcomes assessment by establishing the special Program committee (including representatives of administration, academic staff, students and social partners/stakeholders) with objective to monitor achievement of learning outcomes and to have an assessment at least once per semester with clear guidelines how assessment results could be utilized for the improvement of the Program;
- to update of the official website in a way to reflect current version of the Program. At the time of the Site visit the website presented the version of the Program, which was valid before 2014;
- to update the list literature provided in the Syllabuses of all courses of the Program in order to meet standard requirement of taking new research findings and modern scientific achievements into consideration;

- **Summary of Suggestions:**
 - to make all Program related documentation (particularly Curriculum Map (Learning Outcomes) (SER Annex 9) and Learning Outcomes Assessment Plan, Methods and Map (SER Annex 9) available in English;
 - to introduce additional admission requirement for non-field Master degree applicants to collect e.g. up to 10 ETCS credits of relevant for the European studies field training courses. Exception in this regard could be available only for owners of a Master's degree from so-called neighboring disciplines like Law, Political Science, Economics or Humanities;
 - to include into the list of obligatory courses at least one theoretical course related to the European studies (e.g. "Theories of European Integration" or "Theories of EU Public Policy Analysis", etc.);
 - to reconsider so called two "Seminar Work" courses in order to replace one of them with theoretical mandatory course and to make their content somehow related to the main research projects of students;
 - To divide the course existing course on research methods into two different in-depth qualitative and quantities courses. One of those courses may be compulsory, the second optional;
 - to get rid of unnecessary multiplication of this general information in each of Syllabuses (i.e. a section "Assessment system and criteria" with identical content). Instead of the it would be enough to provide students with indication or internet link, where to find this information;
 - not to limit themselves only with administrative measures and to consider elaboration of more comprehensive strategic plan with distinct measures for stimulating the academic staff to do research, seek to increase its quality and international publicity;
 - to make available all the relevant administrative information concerning the PhD like timing of drafting, maintenance, necessary publication and other relevant details on the web site, that will help students in their orientation and avoid unnecessary inquiries over the phone.

 - the European Studies Doctoral program was developed within the EU-funded project;
 - the Program is interdisciplinary;
 - the curriculum of the Program is drawn up through the involvement of the experts/academic staff of the leading European universities;
 - The academic staff is trained in innovative learning-teaching methods. The methods are integrated and utilized in the studies component of the Program;
 - TSU Institute for European Studies actively cooperates with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and with the EU delegation to Georgia. The EU delegation offers internship for the students of Program;

- modern methods of achieving the learning outcomes of the doctoral program of European Studies were introduced within the framework of the cooperation project with international partners;
 - besides the academic staff directly involved in the Program, advisory services are actively involved in process, including professors of the leading European universities;
 - reports on doctoral students work with the scientific supervisor are submitted at the end of each semester to the administration of the institute within the set deadline;
 - involvement in the Program high qualifications professors with rich academic experience from the leading universities of Europe.

After the analysis of the Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and the Site Visit the Expert Panel discovered the learning outcomes of the Doctoral program in European Studies are in compliance with the objectives determined by the National Qualifications Framework, as well as outcomes determined by the field standard and the program objectives.

The description of learning outcomes includes all needed components as (a) Knowledge and understanding, (b) Skills, and (c) Responsibility and autonomy. The description of the Program learning outcomes is well balanced and combines generic skills with direct references to the content of the European Studies field.

As concerns Program learning outcomes assessment mechanism the Expert Panel could confirm that the mechanism is in place. The learning outcomes are measured using several criteria, including the quality of studies conducted by students, through presentations,

published works, employment indicators, and other mechanisms implemented within each semester or research component. The faculty members in the Program are updated in detail on assessment results through the Law faculty's as well as University's Quality Assurance Service.

However the Self-evaluation Report was less precise how the Program learning outcomes assessment results are utilized for the improvement of the Program. The Self-evaluation Report stresses that a special attention was paid to the recommendations of accreditation experts from 2014. But it says anything how the Program learning outcomes assessment is implemented and how obtained results are utilized for the improvement of the Program as a whole. Therefore the Expert panel recommend strengthening the Program learning outcomes assessment and utilization of the assessment results for the improvement of the Program

The Expert panel noticed that despite that the Program is implemented in English

however not all related documentation was available in English. For instance, the Curriculum Map (Learning Outcomes) (SER Annex 9) and Learning Outcomes Assessment Plan, Methods and Map (SER Annex 9) were not submitted in English.

2. Teaching methodology and organization, adequate evaluation of Program mastering

Program admission preconditions, Program structure, content, teaching and learning methods, and student assessment ensure the achievement of Program objectives and intended learning outcomes.

2.1. Program Admission Preconditions

Higher education institution has relevant, transparent, fair, public and accessible Program admission preconditions.

Descriptive summary and analysis of compliance with standard requirements

After the analysis of the Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and the Site Visit the Expert Panel could confirm that the Program Admission Preconditions take Program characteristics into consideration (it requires Master's degree or its equivalent academic degree, appropriate English language skills and submission of a research project in English). The Program is also open for foreign students. This provision ensures admission of the students with relevant knowledge, skills and competences for mastering the Program.

While the Program admission preconditions are logically linked to the Program content the Expert Panel would like to express its scepticism towards the Provision to keep the Program open for all applicants with Master's degree or its equivalent regardless of its content. The Panel was not persuaded with idea that PhD student, who is enrolled in the program with non-field Master degree (e.g. Physics, Chemistry or Maths) shall be entitled to attend the training courses relevant to the profile provided for on the European Studies Master's program but without passing midterm and final exams. Therefore the Panel is suggesting revising this Provision and considering the idea to introduce additional admission requirement for non-field Master degree applicants to collect e.g. up to 10 ETCS credits of relevant for the European studies field training courses. Exception in this regard could be available only for owners of a Master's degree from so-called neighbouring disciplines like Law, Political Science, Economics or Humanities.

Program admission preconditions and procedures are consistent with existing legislation. Program admission preconditions and procedures are fair, public and accessible at least in Georgian language.

2.2 Educational Program Structure and Content

Program is designed according to HEI's methodology for planning, designing and developing of educational Programs. Program content takes Program admission preconditions and Program learning outcomes into account. Program structure is consistent and logical. Program content and structure ensure the achievement of Program learning outcomes. Qualification to be granted is consistent with Program content and learning outcomes.

Descriptive summary and analysis of compliance with standard requirements

The Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and the Site Visit persuaded the Expert Panel that the Program is designed according to Tbilisi State University methodology for planning, designing and developing of educational Programs. Its structure is consistent and logical. It comprised of 55 ECTS credits and the research component. Program content and structure is consistent with the qualification to the granted and ensure the achievement of Program learning outcomes.

The Program is structured in accordance with Georgian Legislation and European Credits Transfer System. The study component foresees both – mandatory and elective courses. The content of study component takes into account admission preconditions by including into the list of elective courses following subjects as "European Economics", "EU Law", etc. These courses may particularly be helpful for students, which graduated from other than European Studies Master's Programs.

However, the Expert Panel would like to pay attention to the content of mandatory courses. Unfortunately the list doesn't include any obligatory course related to the European studies, especially with "heavy" theoretical dimension. That creates a danger, that students may start reading their research subjects without any given relevant theoretical tools. Therefore the Expert Panel would like to suggest to consider an option to include into the list of obligatory courses at least one theoretical course related to the European studies (e.g. "Theories of European Integration" or "Theories of EU Public Policy Analysis", etc.). This change could be done at the expense of the Preparation of two seminar works, which takes even 20 ECTS credits.

The Expert Panel also has a special note concerning these two Seminar Works. According to the Self-evaluation Report the research component of the Program includes only the preparation of a dissertation thesis and public defence under the relevant rules of the University. But this is not exactly true. The two Seminar Works (by the way with identical syllabuses) are also small research projects. The requirement that these Seminar Works does not represent a part of the thesis is a disadvantage of the Program structure. Students are obliged to spend their time to some extras with limited validity instead of concentrating of their main research subjects. By the way, this impression was confirmed by students/graduates during the Site Visit interviews. The Expert Panel is not persuaded by explanation that those research projects, different from the PhD subject, serve to enlarge students knowledge, sharpen their research skills and broaden their world view.

2.3 Course

- Student learning outcomes of each compulsory course are in line with Program learning outcomes; Moreover, each course content and number of credits correspond to course learning outcomes;
- Teaching materials listed in syllabi are based on the core achievements in the field and ensure the achievement of intended Program learning outcomes.

The Expert Panel on the basis information collected through the Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and Site Visit could confirm that in general student learning outcomes of each compulsory course are in line with Program learning outcomes and each course content and number of credits correspond to course learning outcomes.

As regards the standard requirement for Program content to take new research findings and modern scientific achievements into consideration the Expert Panel discovered serious discontent. In all submitted syllabuses lists of literature provided for all mandatory and optional courses were somehow outdated. The newest literature sources were dated by the year of 2013.

2.4 The Development of practical, scientific/research/creative/performance and transferable skills

Program ensures the development of students' practical, scientific/research/creative/performance and transferable skills and/or their involvement in research projects, in accordance with the Program learning outcomes.

The Expert Panel on the basis information collected through Program Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and the Site Visit confirms that Program ensures the development of students' skill in accordance to the Program learning outcomes. The practical and transferable skills of the students are developed foremost by so called the Professor's Assistantship. This component of the study program includes support of relevant professors of the mandatory academic courses of the Master's program of European studies. Accordingly the research skills of the students are developed by implementation of a research exercises which are mandatory within any of optional course and by writing two seminar papers. Besides that the students participate in conferences and seminars funded by EU and other donors, also in Erasmus+ exchange programs.

Each professor of the Program has an academic position at Tbilisi State University with full compliance with Georgian legislation and internal regulations of the University. Also, the faculty members are involved in almost every work and activities of governmental, private or other non-governmental structures for development of the respective direction.

The number and workload of Program academic/scientific and invited staff ensures the sustainable running of the educational process. 10 professors involved in the Program are fully capable to manage PhD students enrolled in the Program. Among them there are 7 full and 3 associate professors directly involved in scientific supervising.

By studying the Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and during the Site Visit the Expert Panel found that the University quality service is permanently conducting to survey the personnel in order to obtain the information needed for their professional retraining and development.

The Self-evaluation Report acknowledges that increase of productivity, quality and international publicity of researches remains as a problem. However it seems that the University is going to respond to it basically using administrative measures. The Self-evaluation Report indicates that "by the initiative of the department of scientific research and development, minimum scientific requirements were elaborated, which oblige the scientific staff to create highly rated scientific publications". The Expert panel would like to note that it is important not to limit themselves only with administrative measures and

resolutions. It is very important to consider elaboration of more comprehensive strategic plan with distinct measures for stimulating the academic staff to do research, seek to increase its quality and international publicity.

The Expert Panel on the basis information collected through detailed Program Self-evaluation Report, relevant enclosed documents and the Site Visit discovered that the University has a system and policy of internal quality assurance. Implementation of the doctoral program on European studies is monitored and evaluated by the European institute itself and by the quality assurance offices of the University and the faculty of Law. The Self-evaluation Report describes in detail what elements the quality assurance system mostly includes. Unfortunately, the Self-evaluation Report was less informative how findings of internal assessments are utilized for Program improvement. The Report indicated just rather generic points that the findings are used for further improvement of the program implementation. However the interviews with Head of TSU Quality Assurance Department and quality assurance officer of the Faculty of Law were quite informative. The interviewees described in detail how the system was reformed and how it is working. On this basis the Expert Panel concluded that the Program meets the accreditation standards in this regard.

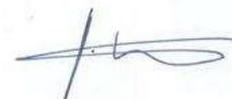
